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From the Golf Course Superintendent By Raymond Bartels, CGCS

The weather is starting to warm up and with this I will be incorporating our Spring/Summer maintenance schedule. We will start Vertical Mowing, Grooming, Spiking, Light Top Dressing and applying pesticides to the Greens on a more frequent basis. These practices are necessary in their upkeep. You will also notice a lot more spot spraying of herbicides throughout the Golf Course to help control Spring and Summer weeds. The Rye-Grass on the Fairways, Collars and Approaches will also start turning brown and dying off. This is known as transition. We will also be applying herbicides and other cultural practices to help with the transition from the Rye back to the Bermuda grass. I apologize in advance for any inconvenience. Enjoy the Golf Course and I hope to see you out there.

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


MASTER BOARD ANNOUNCEMENT

In an effort to maintain quality and safety as well as the best service possible to all our residents, the Master Board has established the following policy:

- 1. All residents with an outstanding balance remaining on their minimum can contact the Food and Beverage Manager to place any order larger than fifty dollars before May 15. These orders will be treated like an event and must be received seven days before requested day of pickup.
- 2. Raw food will not be available for to-go orders or any order, i.e. uncooked steaks/ raw meat.
- 3. We do not have a package goods license for alcoholic beverages and by law cannot offer this as an option.

This policy will allow for the Chef and the F&B Manager to plan and order supplies for larger orders without shorting the dining membership each day.

Strawberry Goat Cheese Bruschetta

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup balsamic vinegar
- 12 slices Italian bread
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 pound strawberries, washed and diced
- 2 teaspoons fresh thyme leaves, plus more for serving
- 1 cup goat cheese, room temperature
- salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

Directions


Heat vinegar in a small skillet over medium-low heat. Simmer until reduced by about half, 8 to 10 minutes. Remove from heat and allow to cool to room temperature.

Prepare a grill for high heat. Place bread slices on a foil-lined baking sheet and drizzle with olive oil.

Combine strawberries and thyme in a small bowl and set aside.

Grill bread on the preheated grill until browned, about 3 minutes per side.

Spread goat cheese on toasted bread. Add black pepper, salt, and reduced vinegar to the strawberry mixture. Spoon over the goat cheese topped bruschetta. Garnish with additional thyme.

BE A HARD TARGET!!!

On Wednesday, March 9, Captain Rick Gerken, Patrol Commander of District 1 of the Manatee County Sheriff's Office, visited Peridia with his Lieutenant and the five-man team that has been patrolling Peridia in marked and unmarked cars and that recently caught the four individuals responsible for a burglary in Sable Harbor. Captain Gerken said that they have the necessary search warrants for the four individuals who were apprehended and will be comparing any items retrieved as a result of these warrants with items reported stolen in the Peridia burglaries. They are hopeful that this is the group responsible for the robberies in our community.

Captain Gerken stressed two main points in his discussion with homeowners. Be a hard target was his first piece of advice. Take steps to secure your windows and doors and set your alarm when you leave for even a few minutes. Criminals look for "soft" targets and we do not want them to think that's what they have found in Peridia. The police believe that the robbers watch people leave for dinner or an evening out and then attempt to break in or are knocking on doors looking for a house with no one at home. When someone knocks, answer them without opening your door! If they give a feeble reason for knocking, saying they are looking for someone other than you, for example, CALL 911 RIGHT AWAY! Captain Gerken stressed the need for homeowner/police cooperation in apprehending criminals and asked us to do our part. There have been 170 directed patrols, in addition to aviation patrols and visits from members of the criminal division of the Sheriff's Dept. since the first robbery here.

Captain Gerken's second main point was to call 911 anytime you see or hear something that you think sounds out of the ordinary. They would much prefer to come out and check something out that turns out to be nothing, than to miss the chance to apprehend a thief who has moved on down the street to an empty house after you saw someone near your house. When your gut tells you something doesn't look right, PLEASE CALL IT IN!!!

The Captain strongly suggested that each resident have a free home survey done by someone from the Crime Prevention division by calling Deputy Russ Younger at 747-3011, Extension 2586. They will survey your home and discuss specific things that you can do to "be a hard target". If you are a seasonal resident, consider calling and scheduling this survey before you head back up north! Both Deputy Younger and Deputy Andres of Crime Prevention were at the meeting and are waiting for your calls!

Use your alarm and consider getting one if you don't have one. Make sure a neighbor has a key to your home and knows how to work your alarm and contact your alarm company in your absence. This neighbor should know when you are expecting to be away and whether you expect any family visits at your home in your absence. They can then recognize an out of place visitor and call it into police. Consider 3M tint on windows, a sound/motion activated barking dog device, motion activated outdoor lights, glass break sensors as part of your alarm system. Have your alarm company out to evaluate your coverage and discuss available options with you. ALWAYS keep your garage door down unless you are in sight of the door. Heading inside for a single moment can result in the theft of something visible in your garage or drive.

Keep your lights on at night around your home and when out walking, take your phone! If you see something unusual or suspicious, be it a person or a vehicle, CALL 911!

If you have a security camera, the Detective hopes that you will register it at the Peridia office, so the police can quickly find out where there might be footage that could assist them in identifying a criminal. Our General Manager asked that you let Valerie know about any cameras, inside or outside your home, and they will maintain the list for the Sheriff's Office.

We are asking that every resident share an e-mail address with Nancy in the office for our e-blast network. 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


