For those of you that don't read your e-mails from Nancy, our poolside tiki bar is now open. We will be open Monday thru Saturday and closed on Sunday. Hours will be from 11 am to 4 pm to start and based on weather conditions. Larry will be our bartender serving up specialty drinks, draft beer, wine and limited cocktails. No TV but plenty of sunshine and fresh air. Come out and have a drink to see what it is all about.

Scams Targeting Veterans and the other E-mail Scams, Traffic, Speeding and Crime Report Update

Several organizations that claim to help veterans have turned out to be scams. If you are contacted by a charitable organization claiming to help veterans, ask for a lot of information including the registration number of the charity, its web address and how much of a donation actually goes to those in need. Don't donate to the charity if it can't give you its registration number. Don't authorize automatic withdrawals from your bank account or credit card to make payments to the charity or fundraiser. Conduct an online search that includes the name of the charity and the word 'complaint' to see if it has been reported for any wrongdoing. Other recent computer scams involve receiving an e-mail from what appears to be from the actual company, such as Sam's Club and Apple. While they appear to be sent from them, they are not. Scammers are phishing from your personal information. You can click on the e-mail address and verify whether it is legitimate or not, which in most cases it isn't. Most e-mail accounts, such as Spectrum allow you to "Block Sender" by entering the bogus e-mail address which then blocks that e-mail address from coming into your e-mail.

This year will bring even more traffic to our neighborhood due to the construction of the apartments located at our main entrance and the 45th Street Widening Project. Exiting onto 37th and utilizing the new 44th street connector is a good alternative if you are traveling 301 towards Bradenton/Palmetto. It is less congested than SR70 and average drive time to 301 is less than 5 minutes. Peridia residents will receive a notice from Manatee Co. regarding an upcoming meeting on February 1 at Manatee Technical College where an update of the 45th St Widening Project will be presented.





We continue to have people speeding within Peridia and all of them are not from the outside. Please remember that the maximum speed limit is 25 MPH (unless a lower limit is posted). Please be aware of walkers, joggers, and others that are in your line of vision. Some of us (including myself) can't move as quickly as we used to and may be unable to move out of the way of a speeding car. If you are walking/jogging/biking, please use the sidewalks or stay as close to the curb as possible. If you see someone speeding or driving erratically, please provide a description of the vehicle and license plate number to the Manatee County Sheriff Traffic hotline at 941-723-5197.

We saw very little crime in Peridia during 2017. There were several instances of items being removed from unlocked cars, one attempted break-in and items removed from open garages and outside Member's homes. It is always wise to lock your car, keep your garage door down and remain aware of suspicious cars/people in the neighborhood. Residents have been very diligent about calling and reporting people soliciting, and suspicious activity/vehicles, which helps reduce crime. Also, a resident called me recently to report that an U.S. flag was stolen from the flag pole affixed to their home. It was reported to the Sheriff's Dept. Please continue to use good judgment and report anything suspicious.


