

The weather is starting to warm up and with this I will be incorporating our Spring/Summer maintenance schedule. This consists of weekly mowing of roughs, lake banks and weekly top dressing of light sand on the greens. You will also notice a lot more spot spraying of herbicides throughout the Golf Course to help control Spring and Summer weeds. The Rye-Grass on the Fairways, Tees, Collars and Approaches is also starting to wilt, turn brown and dye off. This is known as transition. The warmer the temperature gets, the faster the transition will be. We will also be applying pesticides and other cultural practices to help with the transition from the Rye-Grass back to the Bermuda grass. There will be thin areas where the Rye-Grass had the Bermuda covered, this is normal until the Bermuda fills in. I apologize in advance for any inconvenience.

Enjoy the Golf Course and I hope to see you out there.

As I walk through our golfing community our members are also intent on being considerate neighbors. As an older neighborhood, it takes a little more grooming







TRAFFIC UPDATE AND SAFETY TIPS FOR YOUR HOME

Our neighborhood continues to be safe with no recent crimes reported. The traffic, however, is another story. Please be careful exiting and entering the various entrances we have. Police have added extra patrols to monitor speeding mostly from outsiders cutting through Peridia due to construction on 45th. New construction of homes and businesses close by only add to the congestion on

SR70. Wendy's is being built across from the post office and Taco Bell will soon start construction of a new restaurant at SR70 and 33rd Street. The road construction at SR70 and I-75 will continue for quite some time while they re-design the exits. Patience and situational awareness are key to our safety on the roads these days for sure!

This month I thought it would be useful to share some tips we can use to make our home safer. Listed below are few things that we can do to minimize falls and other injuries. I hope you find them helpful.

Bathroom Safety

The bathroom is one of the most dangerous areas of any home, thanks to the slippery surfaces that can cause falls and small space that makes it tough to move around safely. You can improve the safety and comfort of your bathroom by:

- Installing a 'comfort height' toilet that makes it easier to sit and stand.
- Replacing your bathtub with a walk-in shower and a bathing seat.
- Place non-skid strips on the floor of your tub or shower.
- Use a hand-held lightweight shower head to make bathing and cleaning easier.
- Replace your old faucets with temperature-controlled faucets to prevent scalding burns.
- Add a motion-sensor light or night light to your bathroom for added safety at night.
- Install grab bars throughout the room, which can also serve as towel racks.

Kitchen Safety

Many seniors enjoy spending time in the kitchen during their retirement years. To keep cooks safe:

- Install and regularly maintain a high-quality smoke detector that has a 'hush' feature to temporarily silence false alarms.
- Replace old, worn-out appliances with new models to reduce the risk of shock or electrical fires.
- Keep a fire extinguisher handy.
- Move heavy dishes and pots to lower cabinets that are easier to reach.
- Invest in appliances that shut off automatically, such as induction stovetops and kettles that can't be boiled dry.

General Home Safety

By taking the time to increase the safety of your home you will help prevent injuries to yourself and your loved ones.

- Remove any tripping hazards like loose area rugs, uneven floorboards, or extension cords.
- Place motion-activated lights throughout your home to improve visibility.
- Use timers to turn lights on at dusk.
- Purchase battery-backup lighting that is activated during a power outage.
- Always Keep your doors and windows locked . Many break-ins occur during daylight hours.
- Keep rooms clean and free of clutter
- Make sure walkways are free of cords and wires
- Ensure that floors are not too slippery and be aware of differences in floor levels when entering and exiting rooms
- Consider taking a portable phone with you as you move room to room just in case a fall occurs
